

FEDERATION REPORT Jeremy Giard, Federation Director; Gail Giard, Federation Delegate August 15, 2014 Federation Meeting-Hermiston, Oregon

The 2014 NFMS 76th Annual Show & Convention was hosted by Hatrockhound Gem and Mineral Society of Hermiston, Oregon. There were six (6) Competition Cases at the show. All of these six cases were judged and received 1st place ribbons for categories of education, cabochons, spheres, wire gemstone trees, specimens, and petrified woods. The cases were judged in Master, Novice, Junior, and Society expertise areas. There were approximately a total of 25 display cases at the show and 18 dealers inside and 4 dealers outside. Demonstrations included Faceting, Spheres, Silversmithing, and Cabochon Making. Show Chairpersons were Mike Filarski and Judi Allison.

The 2015 show will be held at the Fairgrounds in Ogden, Utah on April 10-12, 2014 and will be hosted by the Golden Spike Club. It is still in the planning stage but will include exhibits and multiple field trips.

The 2016 AFMS/NFMS show will be held in Albany, Oregon on July 29-31, 2016, hosted by the Willamette Agate and Mineral Society and is still in the planning stage. "Treasures of the Northwest" is the theme. Janice Van Cura, is the 2016 Show Chair.

NFMS 1st Vice President Warren Hood discussed the \$18,000 cost of printing and mailing the NFMS newsletters. A committee was formed to see about switching the choice of distribution of the NFMS newsletter from mailing to each member to emailing. The committee proposes each club establish a club editor contact person for the NFMS newsletter. An announcement that the newsletter is ready would be sent to the club editor contact person by Brad Larson, NFMS Webmaster. The club editor would be allowed a choice to receive by email a PDF file of the newsletter or a link to the NFMS site. The local club editor would then advise its' club members of the availability of the NFMS newsletter either by attaching the PDF file or the link out to NFMS site. NFMS would need to be supplied a list of club members who do not have access to the internet and still need to receive the newsletter by mail. Warren is proposing that with anticipated savings NFMS would help clubs improve their NFMS show with money for special lectures, field trips, or displays. The local club would arrange for the programs and then would submit a request for reimbursement. This new budget line item would be in the \$2000 to \$3000 range. Warren would like the club contact person to contact him with his/her thoughts on beginning this new process at <u>warrenrood@yahoo.com</u>.
